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What is Title I?

Henderson Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. What is it?

How is it revised?

Who is it for?

Henderson Middle School is a Title I school. All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are invited, encouraged, and given multiple opportunities to participate in the activities described in this policy. Henderson Middle School serves all students and families regardless of race, ethnicity, or disabilities.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is either included in the student handbook or sent home with students in an orange packet once it has been revised. The plan will also be posted on the school website and/or parents can retrieve a copy of the plan in the front office.

RESERVATION OF FUNDS

2023-2024 District Goals

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone (GMAS) English Language Arts End of Grade Assessment and benchmark assessments will increase by 3 percentage points.

The percentage of students scoring at Developing Learner or above on the Georgia Milestone (GMAS) Math End of Grade Assessment and benchmark assessments will increase by 3 percentage points.

2023-2024 School Goals

Henderson Middle School will decrease the weighted percent of students scoring at Beginning Learner Level on the Georgia Milestones English Language Arts EOG in effort to meet the District's goals.

Henderson Middle School will decrease the weighted percent of students scoring at Developing Learner Level on the Georgia Milestones Math EOG in effort to meet the District's goals.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Henderson Middle School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will share responsibility for improved student academic achievement. It describes how the school and parents will build and develop a partnership that will help children achieve the state's high standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback. The compacts are discussed with parents during parent-teacher conferences and a copy is sent home. Additional copies can be provided by requesting in the front office.

Share and discuss effective ways to monitor student progress. Event may be virtual.

Share and discuss the many ways to work with the school to help your child succeed in Reading and Language Arts. Event may be virtual.

Math and Science Night -February

Visit HMS to meet with your child's teacher and get support with our Math and Science Curriculum. Event may be virtual.

Testing Information- March

Henderson Middle school will offer an information session in the month of March to keep parents informed on the Georgia Milestones Assessment. Event may be virtual.
